I'm a Lion, just like you. I am a native of most of the western United States, from Bakersfield, California to Anchorage, Alaska and I've seen most of the United States at one time or another. I'm a retired Army Medical Service Corps officer, writer and management consultant, so I have gotten to observe what goes on in a large part of the world. In all of these places and roles, I've seen miracles, but most impressive of all of those have been the miracles that came about through Lions service. It's profound. It's nothing less than amazing.

Winning photographers will receive awards. The six (the five category winners and the Best of Show) winning photos will appear on the Lions Website.

## Katelyn Shove SightLife Cornea Recipient



Katelyn's family wasn't aware that she had noticed. Nobody knows how it got there, but, besides robbing Katelyn's vision, the scar on her left eye had opaqued over much of the brown center with a milky white film. But Katelyn HAD noticed. And when a post-surgery look in the mirror told her that both eyes are now that same, the three-year-old from Idaho was one elated little girl.

Katelyn's family is more than a little pleased, too. "Thanks to you guys, we have a beautiful, happy little girl," says Katelyn's grandmother, Arliss Shove. The Northwest Lions Foundation for Sight & Hearing and the Lions Club from Katelyn's community split the cost of the \$8,500 Lions Patient Care Grant that paid hospital and operating room costs associated with the transplant. SightLife Associate Medical Director Dr. Tueng Shen donated her time and skill to do the surgery.

As you might guess, cornea transplant surgery for someone so young as Katelyn is unusual. Of the 2,495 corneas that our eye bank provided for sight-restoring transplants last year, only one or two were for very young children.

Cornea transplants for young children don't come with the same 90-percent-plus guarantee of restored sight as for adults, but early indications for Katelyn are promising. She has already experienced some restored vision in the eye and enjoys the support of a close-knit family.

"Katelyn and her family deserve our very best, and we'll be following her progress closely," said SightLife Vice President Bernie Iliakis. "It is a privilege to be in a position to help a special girl like this."
